History 101

The Spring, 2003 issue marks the debut of this new column for our newsletter. The column appearing in every issue, will focus on some aspect of Sun City / Sun City West history and will be written by a guest columnist. This issue's guest columnist, **Phyllis Street**, reveals to us the whereabouts of an easily overlooked historic site right here in Sun City.

Where, oh where has Marinette gone?

Have you heard of Marinette and wondered why the Recreation Center on Union Hills and 99th was given that name? If you really want to know, you can answer your questions by taking a slow drive going north from Coggins on 105th Ave. toward Grand Ave. On your right is the West Valley Christian Fellowship Community Church. Between the oleander bushes along 105th Ave. you will see a large rock marker with an impressive bronze plaque. Dedicated by the Arizona Questers in 1985, this plaque commemorates the site of the town of Marinette, founded by R. P. Davie from Marinette, Wisconsin.

Mr. Davie had a large acreage extending from New River to the Aqua Fria River. He invested heavily in trying to raise sugar beets. The soil was not productive for beets and he sold out to the Southwest Cotton Company, a subsidiary of the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in Litchfield Park. Cotton became the main crop and lots of laborers were needed to pick the cotton. Marinette became a lively little town including farmers and business people. It had its official Post Office in 1912, the year Arizona became a State.

By 1936, when cotton was no longer needed for tires, the J. G. Boswell Company bought the acreage, brought in machinery to pick the cotton, and with fewer laborers needed to harvest the cotton, the town slowly dwindled in population. Subsequently Boswell sold to the Del Webb Corporation and in **January**, **1960 Marinette became Sun City.** At the Sun Cities Area Historical Society you can see aerial views of what was left of Marinette when Sun City opened on January 1, 1960. And in the oleander bushes along 105th, you can see the commemorative bronze plaque on the marker.

So you don't need to travel to Philadelphia or Washington D.C. or even around the world to see an historic site. You can see an important one right here in Sun City, Arizona.



Del Webb Logo Pin Researched

Our Board member, Ruth Morton, did further research on the Del Webb Logo Pin we recently acquired. She was informed by Jerry Svendsen that he has a pin, given him by Del Webb Corp. for a certain number of years of faithful employment. Other former employees reported the same information, adding that men were awarded the tie pin and women received a necklace.



Stuart Weinland, who donated the tie pin, reported that his father had never been an employee for Del Webb. "When he moved to Sun City he really retired." His father had never explained from whom he had received the pin.
