
#### SUN CITY SCARLET LADIES FEB. 6, 2010

In attendance were Connie, Monies and her daughter, Marion, Vicki, Peggy S., Charlotte, Peggy C, Donna, and guests Gail Bain, Joan Bulmer, and Delora Peterson. Our outing was organized by Connie and Monies. With much diligence Connie Young and Monies Haas worked with the coordinator of the Sikhs who have a place of worship in our near community of Glendale. It is often pointed out when traveling along Hwy. 101 near 51\* Avenue. This building was built by a Dr. who passed away at the age of 45. His mother and father were in the group of Sikh's hosting us as we visited their place of worship. The building consisted of two main buildings, one for lessons and an area to worship, plus a huge area to part take in meals. The Sikhs welcomed us and presented us with a short lecture and video explaining about their faith and articles of faith. One of the more conspicuous and noteworthy of the articles of faith is the Kesh (uncut hair), which is kept covered by a distinctive turban, the other articles are the <u>Kirpan</u> (religous sword), <u>Kara</u> (metal bracelet), Kanga (comb) and Kaccha (undershorts). They all have deep religious meanings for Sikhs, who wear them to honor the teachings, wishes, and memory of their beloved Gurus. They believe in one God, whose name is Truth, the Creator without fear, without hate, A timeless being, beyond births and deaths, self-illuminated, revealed only by the Guru's grace. Each group had a member escort them to various areas and answer our questions such assisted marriages, divorce, education and mixed marriages. The food was considered only a snack and we were told full meals are provided after their worship services. The vegetables (mixed spinach, onions, cauliflower and zucchini) were deep fried in a tempura like batter. The samosas were served with a sweet sour dipping sauce and a mint mixture. Yum, Yum. A great educational outing which met its ultimate goal of educating to help rid fear and profiling of all turbaned persons to be considered terrorists! 




# Lake Pleagant + Scorpion Bay May 6, 2010





Estrella Mountain Community College's enrollment has seen double-digit increases this year.

Overall enrollment is up by 13 percent with the largest increases in social work, nursing and culinary programs, said Carissa Pool, marketing and public relations coordinator.

Dean of Students Lauren Shellenbarger said although anecdotal, much of the growth is a result of the economy.

Arizona's unemployment rate was 9.6 percent in July, slightly higher than national rate of 9.5 percent.

Shellenbarger said many Estrella students were laid off and are now "re-careering," because they can't find jobs.

The school has also seen a large increase in traditional students, who attend Estrella right after high school gradua-

tion, she said.

Culinary student Michael Robles, 18, who graduated from Willow Canyon High School in Surprise in May, said he

was impressed by the culinary teacher's workplace experience and that Estrella, 3000 N. Dysart Road in Avondale, is close to home.

"I think the fact that (Estrella) has a restaurant for students is a big help," he said, referring to Region's, Estrella's student-run restaurant which serves three-course meals twice a week. "We can get all of our experience here, without even having a job."

Estrella opened in 1992, spending five years as a branch of Glendale Community College. In the spring 1997, the Southwest Valley college received its accreditation and welcomed 2,670 students to its campus. Over the past 13 years, that number has increased to 7,550 students.

Maricopa Community Colleges are seeing a 10 percent enrollment gain for 2010-11. More than 106,000 students have enrolled for at least one class, compared with about 97,000 last school year.

Estrella Mountain, Rio Salado, South Mountain and Chandler-Gilbert commu-

nity colleges are leading the way with double-digit percentage increases.

"We are open, and we are just accommodating as best we can to meet the needs of the community and the students are coming in," Shellenbarger said. "We keep our class sizes fairly small ... and we would open another section (if enrollment surpassed) 32 students per class."

After a tour of the morgue, viewing a brain and hearts, we were shown through the laboratory, with workers collecting samples and then had a very inspiring talk by a Doctor doing research with fibromyalgia.

We came away with a new respect for donating organs and hopefully we can be ambassador to encourage donations of all kinds.



## Gebruary 23<sup>nd</sup> Scarlet Ladies February 2011 Outing



We can certainly understand why his grandson wanted to replace his Purple Heart metal. Then to think there was 9 other medals he did not know he had. Wow!!!

Congratulations Chicago Bob, we are so proud of you.

Jimmy Walsh simply wanted his grandfather to replace a Purple Heart medal the Army veteran was awarded during World War II.

"He earned it; he deserved it, so I thought he should have it" said Walsh, an 18-year-old from Glendale.

Wanting to pass the medal on to his grand-children, Robert "Chicago Bob" Renninger, an 86-year-old Sun Citian, submitted the necessary paperwork through the Sun City American Legion Post No. 101 and received his new medal in the mail about six months later—along with nine other medals and awards he did not know he had earned.

"I couldn't believe it," Renninger said. "I never wanted to feel like it was too important. I wasn't there for the medals, I was there to fight."

Dolores, 84, his wife of 58 years was equally shocked, and proud, of her husband's commendations.

"I knew he was in the thick of it," she said, adding he has always been humble about his war experience.

Along with the Purple Heart, he earned a Bronze Star, Army Commendation Medal, Good Conduct Medal, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Army of Occupation Medal with German clasp, Combat Infantryman First Award, Honorable Service lapel but-

ton and a Sharpshooter Badge with Rifle Bar.

Renninger was drafted in the Army in 1944 when he was 18, four months before graduating from high school. Just two months after enlisting, he was on the front lines in Europe. He earned the Purple Heart when he was shot in the face while taking cover in a foxhole.

"It's hard to get a medal like that. I carry (the wound) with me all the time. I had part of my nose shot off," he said.

His reluctance to speak about the war has in no way diminished his esteem among family members. "I think it's amazing what he did (during the war)," Walsh said. "He's always been a hero to the family." Scarlet Ladies Red Hat Outing, Luncheon at Abuelo's, hosted by Alyce Coluson






#### February 21, 2013

A nice day and a great outing.






















Scarlet Ladies of Sun City Red Hat Outing. Historic Old Town, Scottsdale and The Sugar Bowl


