Please forgive this very late reply to your request. Obviously, I have just neglected this task - and I hope it's not too late to serve the purpose.

I am returning your print and have indicated a change. I do not question the publication but I do question the facts as written by the informant.

Suggested revision based on facts from Youngtown Historical Society documentation:

The Youngtown Development Co. was formed in November, 1954. The first home was built on Alabama Avenue. By fall of 1955, 125 homes had been built, 85 lots had been sold and National advertizing in magazine only 40 lots remained. television's WIDE. WIDE WORLD with and national Dave Garroway assured the new development's success. Youngtown residents organized their own recreation activities instead having them provided by development ventures and of residents were restricted to 50 years of age.

Youngtown had become the first full-fledged retirement community in the United States. Developer Ben Schleifer, had come to Arizona for his health and remembered a promise he had made to a New York friend to create an active retirement community. He bought the Frances Greer dairy ranch and he, Mrs. Greer, and Elmer Johns, who had managed a retirement complex in Lakewood California formed the Youngtown Development Co.

Youngtown Development Co. did view the Webb development as threatening any Youngtown growth but the Youngtown Historical Society has no documentation as to who initiated any discussion with Sun City or Peoria (which became incorporated in 1960 because they feared annexation by Youngtown).

Dear Mrs. Freeman:

Marguerite and I are enjoying Jubilee. It is a very well down story of Sun City.

One paragraph was particularly of interest to us:

"And then there was the Nebraska publisher who moved to Sun City but continued to write his weekly column from his home. He called it "The Kick in Sun City, "

The publisher was my father, J. Hyde Sweet, and his newspaper was the Nebraska C ity Daily News-Press, where I worked most of my working life. Dad was the publisher of this paper, Nebraska's first and oldest newspaper, for 55 years.

My father never retired. No matter where he was he sent me his column, The Kick Kolumn, and two or three good editorials every day. Our paper was published six days a week and seldom were we without the Kick Kolumn. My parents spent parts of about 30 winters in Wickenburg; the column written there was The Kick in Wick.

My parents were 80 years old when they bought a garden apartment at 10586 Oakmont in Sun City. Dad had a stroke in April of 1964 and he was taken to the hospital at Wickenburg where he died two days later. When we got out here and went to the apartment I found my dad's finalcolumn, half written, in his typewriter.

When it became time for my parents to pick up the key of their apartment in August, 1960, dad said he was going to drive out here and then return home. I told hkm he surely wouldn't want to drive to Arizona in the heat of the summer, but he said he was going to and he did. He loved Arizona and was the best press agent the state ever had. I wish you could read some of things JHS (as he signed his column) wrote about Sun City; of course I do not have them here for they are in the files of the paper in Nebraska City.

Iworked until I was 70 years old and then Marguerite and I sold the paper because there was no one to take it over. Our family consisted of a girl who did not want to run a newspaper. We kept the Oakmont apartment until we moved here in 1976 to live in a house. Then we sold the apartment.

I am telling you these things just for your information. I had quite a reaction when I read the paragraph in your story mentioned above.

By mutual agreement with Don Tuffs, Vice President of DEVCO, our arrangements with them for the guarantee of the costs of printing "Jubilee - 25th Anniversary of Sun City" have been canceled. We are now out from under hierarchy censorship and are free to proceed with the publication of the book as we originally planned.

Off the record, we feel Don Tuffs was placed in the middle and was under great pressure to subvert our book into a P.R.tool for the present management. Before he would agree to let go, he wanted to make sure we would not be left without financing, and we were happy to assure him that we felt arrangements could be made.

To assist in the transition so that printing will not be further delayed, he has authorized the printer to proceed with the 6 chapters already submitted and that DEVCO would stand by their guarantee until specific alternate arrangements have been completed.Other chapters are now ready and will be submitted next week.

We have made arrangements with the Lions Foundation and its member Clubs to assist in the mechanics of distribution and sale of the book. Since we do not have a legal entity through which to handle income, sales tax etc., they will provide that service. The understanding is if any profits accrue after repayment of the advance, the excess will be divided between the Foundation and the Sun City Library which will house the historical memorabelia.

Our contract with the printer calls for payment of approximately 1/3 with the submission of the first copy, 1/3 with the final copy and 1/3 at the time of publication. Depending on the total number of pages, halftones etc.the total contract cost for 10,000 copies will be between \$28,000 and \$30,000.

To get things started, and to keep your anonimity assured, we suggest that your advance be made through the Lions Foundation who will then handle payments direct to the printer under our guidance . The first installment to the printer is due now, and another by mid August or perhaps before . If you do not wish to advance the full \$30,000 now, we think \$15,000 would see us through to September.

By mutual agreement with Don Tuffs, Vice President of DEVCO, our arrangements for them to guarantee costs of printing "Jubilee - 25th Anniversary of Sun City" have been canceled. We are now out from under hierarchy censorship and are free to proceed with the publication of the book.

Off the record, we feel Don Tuffs has been placed in the middle and was under great pressure to make this a P R tool for the present management. Before he would agree to let go, he wanted to make sure we would not be left without financing, and we were happy to assure him that we felt arrangements could be made.

To assist in the transition so that printing will not be further delayed, he has informed the printer to proceed with the 6 chapters submitted and that DEVCO would stand by their guarantee until specific alternate arrangements have been completed.Other chapters are now ready and will be submitted next week.

We have made arrangements with the Lions Foundation and its member Clubs to assist in the mechanics of distribution and sale of the book. Since we do not have an legal entity through which to handle income, sales tax etc., they will provide that service. The understanding is if any profits accrue, excess will be divided between the Foundation and the Sun City Library which will house the historical memorabelia.

Our contract with the printer calls for payment of approximately 1/3 with the submission of the first copy, 1/3 with the final copy and 1/3 at the time of publication. Depending on the total number of pages, halftone etc.the total contract cost for 10,000 copies will be between \$28,000 and \$30,000.

To get things started, and to keep your anonimity assured, we suggest that your advance be made through the Lions Foundation who will then handle payments direct to the printer under our guidance .Thje first installment to the printer is due now, and another by mid August or perhaps before . If you do not wish to adnace the full \$30,000 now, we think \$15,000 would see us through to September. Greetings, Sandy, from c-o-o-l Wisconsin. Brrrr is all I'll say.

Reading the minutes, I was reminded that I had promised the Board more info on reprinting JUBILEE. I have received samples of the printer's work, and it is first class. The company, Fidlar Doubleday of Portage, MI, has invested in newer and better scanning equipment, and are running some test scans of some of the pages to send to me. If those appear acceptable, I think we should order a supply of copies.

As you know, I have been looking for a short-run, "on-demand" publisher, and finally found one with reasonable costs. Most of the others bake in services we don't need to help an aspiring author prepare his/her book for printing, cover design, provide marketing counsel, warehouse books, mailings to book dealers, etc.

Fidlar Doubleday has given us some very attractive prices. The start-up cost, regardless of quantity, includes

- 15.00 Printed cover proof
- 0.05/page for proffs of printed text (272 pages x .05 = 13.60)
- 0.25/page to scan text (68.00)
- 100.00 to scan cover
- 20.00 cover file set-up
- 20.00 text file set-up
- 20.00 cover file conversion
- 20.00 text file conversion

Total first-time charges: \$276.60

Printing costs are as follow: 25 copies @ \$7.15 ea. + 276.60 = 455.35 or 18.21/copy 50 copies @ \$7.15 ea. + 276.60 = 634.10 or 12.68/copy 100 copies @ \$6.93 ea + 276.60 = 969.60 or 9.70/copy 250 copies @ \$6.89 ea.+ 276.60 = 1999.10 or 8.00/copy

If we wanted the books individually shrink-wrapped (like the SCW history books), there would be an additional cost of 0.18 per book. The above figures do not include shipping expense.

Let's say we ran only 50 copies for a cost of \$634.10 to give us a supply. We could sell the books for \$15 ea to cover our costs. When they were gone, we could order another 50 for only \$357.50 (7.15 ea) -- we pay the \$276.60 just the first time, regardless of quantity. We could then drop the price to \$10 a copy and still make nearly \$3 per copy.

That would be my recommendation -- assuming the proofs they are sending me show that the halftones throughout the book can be scanned with minimal loss of quality. We can expect that, but we do not want a book full of muddy, filled-in halftones!

Once we have books on hand, a local news release will generate some sales. We could also package the book with membership in the Society for a special price -- say \$50 for individuals. Maybe we could get Ken Meade Realty to accept a counter display, and to sell books to prospects. No doubt, you and others will come up with more ideas to sell JUBILEE.

Please propose the above to the Board for me, and let me know what decision is reached.

Thank you for your very complete and comprehensible reply. Using your calculator, I find that 100 copies of our book would cost \$873 plus a sign-up fee of \$699. A total of \$1572, or \$15.72 per copy.

I assume scanning would be extra. We realize that the half-tones will not reproduce as well after being scanned and printed, but we no longer may have all the original photos. What would you charge for scanning 272 pages, approximately 100 of which have photos?

We are interested in your simplest package as this book has next to no appeal beyond Sun City. It's a recording of the community's first 25 years, and you have to live here to be interested in that subject. There might be possible interest among colleges and universities offering urban planning courses as Sun City was really the first, master-planned community for those 55 and older. But, we have not found a good database of school/course/professor names to use in marketing this book to this potential audience. Does your organization offer marketing services, as well as printing?
