HISTORY OF THE INTERIM CHAPEL

In March of 1979 the Sun City-Youngtown Ministerial Association discussed the establishment of a Protestant Worship Service in Sun City Already in negotiations for the purchase of property in Sun City West on which to erect church buildings, five denominations accepted responsibility for conducting "trial" services during April 1979. Clergymen of five churches (American Lutheran, Episcopal, United Church of Christ, United Methodist and United Presbyterian) met again on May 3, deciding to retain the joint-worship format, with rotating leadership responsibilities, until the second Sunday in October, at which time the five would commence individual services. This termination date for THE INTERIM CHAPEL was delayed, by commen consent, until November 25.

On November 5 the clergy of each denomination met to establish time and place for each to hold their worship services in the Johnson Recreation Center Social Hall or Lecture Hall, where they met until each were able to build their own churches.
