Dear Mr. Allen:

First of all, I want to thank you for the wondeful Silver Celebration Book. Frequently, I tell my fellow PORA Board members, "we'll have to see what the Allen Bible has to say on that subject."

A SCW resident has challenged me on one of PORA accomplishment listings, which he refers to as "brags," specifically "stopped high density,low income housing vs. Corte Bella. Reference pages 253-254. While PORA's initial response was too soft and may have triggered the formation of the SCW Community Coalition, PORA presumeably was working their connection with then Supervisor Brewer as to density. To their credit, the Coalition gained 12,000 petitioners' signatures. Likewise each group had different density levels in mind but obviously opposed Contintal Homes.

Det 1977 Dever 7977 Siwice? At that same time, PORA had strong connections to Brewer, who facilitated the blocking of the Deer Valley connection to # 303. It is interesting that you state Supervisor Brewer informed Continental Homes that "the county would not approve a density level above the limit recommended by PORA & requested they withdraw its application if they could not meet it." They withdrew.

Two years later, Del Webb pursued the area but in the process backed off. Simultaneously, a multi-generation developer became interested in the site, prompting PORA to get re-involved, while getting Webb reactivated again. Finally stating, "PORA was the successful negotiator."

Perhaps to be absolutely correct & proper, PORA should say, "Fought high density & multi-generational developers @ Corte Bella site ." Ironically, the Coalition joined PORA in opposing Walgreens at Deer Valley & 151st. according to your book.

Is that a fair assessment of what happened?

Hope to get into one of your classes, but response work like this can be consuming along with the heavy load of items. Thanks again.

### THE STORY OF THE SUN CITY WEST HISTORY PROJECT

Working on a project for the SCW VC in 2000, approached Del Webb Corp for pictures. Learned they had all been given to the SCAHS when SCG opened.

Contacted SCAHS for permission to look through the SCW files.

Met Phyllis Street, SCAHS Pres.

Made several visits to SCAHS for pix.

Street brought up matter of SCW's 25th anniversary and need to write it up

Finally bit and said I'd be interested in working on that.

Thought we were looking at a 24-page brochure perhaps.

Once I said I'd do it, Street showed me the JUBILEE

Need for a committee. Recruited Street as knowing SCAHS and its archives Learned Jane Freeman, JUBILEE author, was in community & recruited her. Ran articles in local newspapers, looking for volunteers interested in history. Some 16 showed up for an organizational meeting.

To jump-start project, I'd prepared outline based loosely on JUBILEE
Group agreed to accept as a "working document," subject to change
Outline contained 8 major areas; asked for a "champion" for each.
Freeman volunteered to write the pre-history – events prior to 1978
Barbara Griggs volunteered to review old newspapers & list major events
Eleanor Nelson, author and AZ Republic columnist, took PORA history
Others signed up to research and write most of the remaining sections

Met monthly to report on progress and goal for the coming month.

Found I had a very dedicated group, and work moved along.

Talking with individuals led to many interesting anecdotes about early life here,
Dee Balaker and great cricket drive
DEVCO Entertainment as residents not welcome in SC facilities
Annual grape festival

Many facts unknown to later arrivals like myself.

The books arrived right on time from the printer on January 31. They were placed on sale the following day in the Visitors Center and at the quilt show at the Madison.

We had sales tables at the two rec centers on Saturday, Feb. 15, to greet those attending the afternoon birthday parties. While both centers seemed to have similar-sized crowds, we sold almost twice as many books at RHJ as we did at Palm Ridge. One reason was the poor location we had at the latter. Most of the sellers were moved into the ballroom, but we were left in the hallway. About half the attendees entered and exited via the east door without ever seeing our display.

Presentations were made to Realtors at both Ken Meade offices, Re-Max and Caldwell-Banker. The approach stressed the value of new sales reps learning something about the history of the community, and the appropriateness of using the book as a gift to purchasers in this the 25th anniversary year. One couple was convinced and bought 11 books on the spot. The rest of the sales were single copies, but the seed has been planted.

Presentations were also given at Grandview Terrace and Heritage Traditions. In both instances, sthe Pioneers living there were recognized, and we had some lively discussions. Later this month, the "show" moves to The Madison and Epoch Assisted Living.

The net result was a sale of 782 books during the month of February. I've heard many positive comments regarding the book -- even got a call from one person who claimed they "couldn't put the book down." In response, I tell them to talk up the book with friends and neighbors, and write a letter to the newspaper. As word spreads, I feel confident that sales will expand.

At this point, four typos have also been called to my attention. I'll let you find them on your own: -) A couple of omissions have been pointed out, but only one is serious. We completely overlooked the veterans

organizations and the Avenue of Flags. I'm going to suggest to the Historical Society that we publish an apology, acknowledging the past sacrifices and present contributions that veterans have made to our community. It was a completely unintentional oversight, and one we regret.

We had a great deal of publicity during February -- the papers were very good to us, even though they often forgot to tell where the books could be purchased, and gave my name & phone number instead. The latest was the March Rec Center News. They've all been given the correct info but rarely list the SCW Visitors Center and Historical Society as places where the books can be obtained.

Next time you're in the Library, notice the historical display on the Return Counter. I just put up the second in the monthly series, and hope to have enough ideas to carry this through October.

You might be interested to learn that I approached the Sundome about selling books there. Learned there are two hurdles to cross. First, we must get permission from the organization that has rented the Sundome — many performers actually rent the building and keep all the ticket proceeds. If ASU/Sundome is sponsoring the event, then we have only the second hurdle to cross: 20% of the sales price of any item sold in the Sundome goes to ASU. That's true of CDs and records sold by performers. So, we're not selling books there, but have gotten permission from the West Valley Symphony to put up posters during their events, calling attention to the book and its availability at the VC and SCAHS.

That's the report for February. Be sure to tell your friends and neighbors about the book, and direct them to the VC or to the SCAHS over in Sun City. Thanks for your continued support!

Our SCW history book is finally on its way to the printer via Fed Ex!!

It's taken a good two weeks longer than I expected, but we'll have a better book as a result. The delay has been a result of the indexing process. While software-driven, it still requires manual input. We learned a new benefit of an Index in that it exposes inconsistencies, and misspellings. When two people's names appear in the Index, one after the other, and only differing by one letter, it's a sign that one may be misspelled. Both Index and text get corrected as a result.

Those were the simple things to fix. An Index also permits the cross-indexing of items, and multiple listings for the same item. For example "Sundome." We used that short-hand reference along with an occasional "Sundome Center for the Performing Arts." Once or twice its correct name appears: "Arizona State University's Sundome Center for the Performing Arts." "Board," "Advisory Board" and "Governing Board" provided challenges of their own.

The indexing process picks up each listing but the cross-referencing is a manual addition. Assuring that the proper cross references were in place took extra time. The software showed a tendency to "remember" early references which were updated as we went forward...and then began to pop those in in strange places. Took most of a day to settle it into final, stable form.

Several trees have been sacrificed in the process of printing out the many versions for proofing of not just the Index but the 24 chapters as well. Jo Ruck provided a final read-through, and her eagle eye picked up many inconsistencies in text, along with a misspelled word or two. I'm sure we probably still have a typo or two, but it won't be for lack of trying on the part of our many proof-readers and editors!

O'Neil Printing will receive the CD containing the book content on Monday. They are closed Tuesday and Wednesday, so I probably won't receive a printing/proofing schedule from them until after Christmas. At that time, I'll be able to tell whether or not we'll have proofs in time for the Friday, Jan. 3 meeting at Briarwood -- or whether we will need to postpone it.

I'll let you know just as soon as I hear.

In the meantime, here's wishing a Joy-filled Christmas Season to you and yours! See you next year!

REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- Nov. 5, 2002

Next Meeting - 9:00 am, Briarwood, Friday, Jan. 3, 2003 to check printer's proofs.

Present at the meeting were Allen, Balaker, Carlino, Coor, Ruck, Schmidt, Schoeberle, Silvis, Street and Vogel. Special quests were Connie McMillin, President of the Sun Cities Area Historical Society Board, and Bruce Ellison, our copy editor. Excused were Brozman, Freeman, Larson and Nelson.

Book status was reviewed. Allen reported it has grown from the earlier estimate of 240 pages with 80-100 illustrations to 320 pages and 140 illustrations. Preliminary printing quotes indicated a cost of about \$3.00 per copy. Actual quotes have come in at \$3.40 per copy. Photos are currently being scanned, an index is being added, Library of Congress number and copyright application have been obtained, and book layout has begun.

Cover layouts were reviewed, and Mary Silvis's suggestion to add color to the sunburst was a winner! The committee discussed Ed Allen's name appearing on the cover and it was decided that this should appear as "Edson F. Allen, Editor." The years "1978 - 2003" will also be added as part of the title.

Text for the introductory pages was reviewed and we had a great discussion over proper comma usage. Other typos were found in the preliminary pages despite the number of people who have previously read these pages. Content was OK - but entire text needs another proofreading. Basic layout was well received. The 11-point Century Schoolbook is very readable. Margins are set to provide additional space in the gutter. A

fine line needs to be added around each illustration to separate light areas from surrounding paper. Ed Allen will check to see if the software can avoid hyphenations of two letters or less.

A version using a second color was shown, and received favorable comments until the cost became known. It appears that this would add 70-cents to the cost of each copy.

Quotes from 3 of 5 printers were reviewed. Additional marketing expenses raise the cost per copy to \$6.60. Selling the book for \$10/copy would result in net income to the Historical Society of \$25,000. At \$12/copy, they would realize nearly \$40,000. The committee voted to recommend that the selling price be \$12. A question was raised regarding bulk sales to banks, realtors, etc. and it was felt that a special price should be offered to these types of outlets.

In discussing coordination with the Anniversary Committee, Lee Vogel offered to express our interest in being included in the special anniversary insert for the Sun City Independent. Ed Allen reported on the need for approval from the Rec Center Governing Board to sell books on Rec Center property. Now that we are confident that books will be available by late January, he will approach the Board for approval so that planning for staffing of sales tables can begin.

All agreed that publicity is needed, and once the book price is established, we will be in a position to get newspaper coverage. Lee Vogel was asked to talk with the Anniversary Committee's publicity committee to get the book mentioned along with the bell and cookbook in future releases that they send out. While we are two separate committees, we both are working toward a common goal: celebration of the community's first 25 years.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the History Committee would be to review page proofs from the printer. A tentative date 9:00 am, Friday, Jan. 3, was set. Meeting will be at Briarwood.

The final drafts of the last chapters are almost complete. Thirteen chapters have been checked by our editor, Bruce Ellison, and the remaining 11 will be ready for him when he returns in September. Bruce's long association with Sun City West has added to his value as an editor - he really knows our history!

Earlier, I had indicated I would be sending each committee member a copy of the final manuscript for review. I've rethought that, however, based on the experience of others. First of all, it would involve a massive amount of paper and postage. The complete draft manuscript runs more than 160 pages. My summer home is in the country and the nearest town has no Kinkos or other "quick" printer. It's also too long to send as an e-mail attachment.

More significantly, I don't know how I would handle comments on 24 chapters from 14 critics! Nearly all the material has been checked by those closest to the subject. The chapter on the Sundome, for example, was checked by five individuals including Colleen Jennings-Rogansack. The section on PORA has been seen by Gene Wilson, Bob Williams, Hal Lind, Sandy Goldstein, Morey Jensen, Phil Garner and Randy Fuller. Rec Center content has been reviewed by Bill Woodyard, R. G. Anderson-Wycoff, Hal Lind and others. And so on through the rest of the material.

Rather than send each cof you the entire manuscript, I'd like to suggest this compromise. Attached is a copy of the Table of Contents. If you have a strong interest or personal knowledge in a particular subject, let me know which chapter(s) you'd like to review and I'll send it(them) to you via e-mail. Chapters 1-13 are available now. Others will be forwarded as they are completed.

I will be giving copies of the complete manuscript to the four committee

members who also serve on the board of the Historical Society (Brozeman, Freeman, Schoeberle and Street), as well as to the Board's president. They will represent the Historical Society's interests. I've also promised to give John Waldron a courtesy copy.

Our next meeting is tentatively scheduled for 9:00 am, Tuesday, Nov. 5 at Briarwood. Between now and then, I'd like to have any additions, changes or corrections so we can begin giving a printer the completed version in early November. With the 25th Anniversary Committee planning events earlier than our Feb. 15, 2003 target date, we'll need to have completed copies for sale by mid- to late January if possible.

Let me know which chapter(s) you feel you can contribute to by reviewing the text, and I'll send you a copy. I feel confident that the text has been well researched, checked by appropriate individuals and that we will all be proud of the final product.



Greetings from Wisconsin where Summer has finally arrived! We wish we could have sent you some of the rain that's set records in May and June. Everything is green and lush as a result - and the mosquito crop promises to be an abundant one, too.

It's hard to believe that there are only six more months to the 25th anniversary of Sun City West. Thirteen chapters of the book have been finalized, and Bruce Ellison has edited them. Ten of the remaining eleven are well along, with only one chapter still to be developed.

While work is progressing on the final chapters, it's time to begin thinking about the Marketing Plan for our Sun City West history. I've been working on this but before I send you a draft, need some help with numbers.

To begin with, here are two proposed objectives for the Marketing Plan:

1) Make it easy and attractive for Sun City West residents to obtain a copy of the "Sun City West Silver Celebration - The First 25 Years." 2) Gain visibility and funding for the Sun Cities Area Historical Society (SCAHS) through successful sale of this book.

Making it "easy" has to do with sales outlets for the book. Making it "attractive" has to do with the selling price. The goal being to get the book into the hands of as many Sun City Westers as possible. At the same time, we must remember that this is a fund-raising activity for the SCAHS, so we need to price the book so they realize income from its sale.

It appears our preparation and printing costs will be about \$3 per copy. If we add another \$1 per copy for warehousing, distribution, inventory control and monthly reporting - all done for the SCAHS by SCW Visitors Center volunteers - and another \$2 per copy for the selling organization, the cost will be about \$6 per book.

With that as background, how many books are we likely to sell, and at what price?

As a starting point, we might look at US Census figures for Sun City and SCW. In 1985, Sun City had 23,000 households and purchased 10,000 books. Jane Freeman tells me they probably could have sold more, but elected not to go back on press. The 2000 Census tells us SCW has 15,000 households,

so proportionately we should be able to sell 6,500 copies, assuming an equally attractive price.

The 1985 "Jubilee" sold for \$5 per copy which just covered the expense of printing. Adjusting this for inflation, the equivalent 2003 figure would be \$8.18.

Somehow, I feel we can do better than this, and sell more books at a higher price. If we sold the books for \$8 per copy, the SCAHS would realize just \$2 per copy. In looking at the various 6 X 9", 250-page books on my shelves, I find few under \$10. Many are closer to \$20 - so we may be able to command a higher price, and greater income for the Historical Society without jeprodizing volume.

I'd like your thoughts on the proper balance between volume and pricing. More specifically:

1) What volume of books do you feel we can sell, and what is the "right' price to achieve this?

2) What is the most we should charge? If we charged that, would we sell fewer books? How many fewer? Ten per-cent fewer? Twenty per-cent fewer?

Please send me your "best guesses"by July 17. I'll then fill in the blanks for various pricing scenarios, and send you a proposed Marketing Plan for further comment. This plan also describes proposed sales outlets which I won't cover in this e-mail. We will need to have a complete plan ready for presentation to the SCAHS Board in the Fall.





Eleanor, I only wanted to keep the door open long enough for the committee to "judge the book by it cover." The book's cover consists of two elements ... a title and a visual of some kind. In the case of the "Jubilee" the visual was quite simple: typeface plus background color. I believed the committee might feel differently if they saw "Lizard Acres" in an appropriate context which I could not describe adequately in words. That's why I wanted to show how it might be used to illustrate how far we've come in 25 years.

Newcomers to the community see a completed community, and think it's always been that way. It hasn't, and that's what our book is all about. the growth of a city of 31,000 people with unparalleled amenities in what was barren desert just 25 years ago! That's almost magical to me, and exciting. I find many of my neighbors interested in the stories of the ealry days that I'm now able to tell them -- they indicate over and over, "I had no idea!" I just think it would be neat for the cover to reflect this in some way to appeal to the "pioneers" who remember the good? old days, and to the newly arrived who are amazed when they learn the extent of the progress we've made in a short 25 years.

We've got a number of good ideas, I believe, and you'll be relieved to know that only one references Lizard Acres. It may not be the top choice, and that's fine. I only ask that I be given a chance to present the complete idea of words and illustration. Is that so hard to accept? I'm willing to go with one of the other ideas, or perhaps a 5th or 6th if better ideas evolve as we look at the work that's been done to date.

See you Tuesday -- I think you'll find some good ideas in the cover designs.

# REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- Jan. 15, 2002

We welcomed a new member, Dee Hjermstad, to our committee. Others present were Allen, Balaker, Carlino, Coor, Larson, Ruck, Schoeberle, and Stoneking.

The major part of our time was spent reviewed the individual sections, and the places where help is needed.

A. Preparing the Way for SCW - Complete

B. The Pioneer Years –Judy Schoeberle reported they have 9 excellent interviews to draw from, and three more are planned. Mary Silvis and she have gathered many personal accounts of life in the 1978-79 period, and they will be able to provide the book with a sense of what the early residents found when they moved in, and what they did with their time.

C. Physical Evolution of the Community – This section is almost completely written with a few small pieces of missing information. Louie Coor is gathering data on the golf course opening dates, lengths, etc. Jo Ruck agreed to make a third contact of the three missing churches (Crown of Life Lutheran, First Assembly of God and Palm

West Community Church).

D. Growing Scope of Active Retirement - No report as Street and Brozman were

missing. Allen will contact them.

- E. Growth of Health Care and Human Services Larry Carlino reported that the section on the Foundation is done and that he is gathering material on assisted living. Betty Stoneking volunteered to take the extensive history received from Sun Health and to edit if. Jane Freeman had given Larry the names of several key Sun Health officials, and the edited version will be sent to them for comment. Dr. Hyashi remains as elusive as ever. It was suggested that we see if we can get the WESTER interested in pursuing a story about him as a way of getting something for our book. In a subsequent phone call, Ed agreed to contact Lyle Thompson on Thursday.
- F. Political Evolution of the Community No report as Nelson was missing. Earlier this month, she had indicated she had about completed the section.
- G. Issues Affecting Future History Ed and Larry have agreed to tackle this after their respective sections are complete. It appears that this section will focus on five key issues: Aging of the community (people and facilities), challenges to our current form of governance, growth of the surrounding area, water, and maintaining high property values. There are many, many issues but we will seek to identify a few, key ones that the community will have to deal with in the years ahead.
- H. Title and Cover Design Jo Ruck added "Memories Are Made of This ... The Past, Present and Future of SCW" to our list of possible book titles.

In discussing publicity for the history project, Jo Ruck offered to send copies of the photo taken last month to our three local newspapers. Ed will send her a suggested caption and identify the members in the photos. We'll also list those not present. Ed will also prepare a brief article for each of the papers seeking information to fill in some of the holes in our knowledge – and build interest in the subject at the same time.

The matter of celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was mentioned, and Dee Hjermstad suggested we call this to the attention of Elaine McGrath-Anderson as the Rec Centers would be the best positioned to provide leadership for such an event.

The need for a "marketing plan" was briefly discussed. Jo Ruck suggested that the Visitors Center might be a good source to contact regarding distribution. Ed Allen indicated he had asked them if they were interested, and they would be willing to assist.

In discussing future issues, the subject of "volunteerism" came up as it is unlikely that tomorrow's residents will view this differently than those of the past. Dee Hjermstad noted that this is already of concern, and no place more than the Rec Center Board. There are three openings on the next Board, and so far only two individuals have filed. Filing must be completed by February 1, and she strongly urged us to encourage good people to volunteer for this important position. She even offered to help get the necessary 200 signatures for capable candidates!

# REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- April 16, 2002

# NOTE: Next Meeting - Date to be determined...late October or early November

Present at the meeting were Allen, Balaker, Brozman, Carlino, Coor, Nelson, Ruck, Silvis, Street and Vogel.

Ed Allen welcomed the attendees and advised them that Betty Stoneking had resigned from the committee. Also, Dee Hjermstad views herself as an "interested party" and not a committee member. Please revise your committee membership list accordingly. We appreciate Dee's serving as our sponsor for today's meeting.

The committee is fortunate to have obtained the services of an accomplished graphic designer, Paul Turley, to design the book's cover at no cost to us. Four layouts were presented and discussed. The committee voted unanimously in favor of the cover featuring the library, a SCW landmark. Two modifications were requested. One, the line of type at the bottom should be white instead of red to be more legible. Second, the committee would like to see a design variation with the gold sunburst in place of the white one.

It was agreed that a "Dedication" should be added to the front of the book. The suggested text was approved with one change. Since SCW is not incorporated, the reference to "city" should be changed to "community."

The committee worked their way through a comprehensive, four-page outline of the book's contents. Key suggestions included:

- a) It was agreed that we would not attempt to include pictures of each of the 17 churches. Jo Ruck questioned the number of churches as she believes there are more than 17. She will check her list and review with Ed Allen.
- b) Chapter on Volunteerism should stress the importance residents have placed on serving others. In addition to the three activities covered in detail (Pride, Posse and Variety Show), we should acknowledge other volunteer activities: working with schools, Habitat for Humanity, Westside Food Bank, hospital, etc. Barbara Brozman agreed to write an introduction for the chapter that covers this.
- c) Chapter on clubs will include photos of a variety of club activities. We realize we can not include a photo of each club, but will try to cover the largest clubs. It was agreed that we want action photos, not static shots of rows of club members. Where people are recognizable, they should be identified in the caption.
- d) The Health Care section should include a chapter on fitness as that has been important to residents from the very beginning – it's not just something recently discovered by the boomers! Among the things to be covered would be the Fitness Fairs, the fitness work-out stations between the RHJ walking track and lawn bowling, Sun Health's Advantage Program (which may be covered elsewhere in the health section), programs like Jazzercize and water aerobics, and the fitness rooms in each of the rec centers.
- e) The story of early health care is too brief to be a separate chapter, and should be folded into an introductory paragraph for the section on the hospital.

- f) Interfaith Services, being worked on by Phyllis Street, should be a chapter under health care as most of their services are health-related.
- g) The chapter "Assisted Living" needs to be renamed as it also includes nursing homes. "Extended Care' was suggested.

Ed Allen introduced the need for a marketing plan. It was felt that we could hold off on this until the fall. In the meantime, committee members will be thinking of how we should estimate the number to be sold, and the selling price. It was felt that \$15 would be tops, and \$12-13 more appropriate.

In regard to warehousing and distribution, Ed indicated the Visitors Center would be willing to provide secure storage. They would also be willing to have their volunteers sell books at various 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary activities. It was suggested that \$3 per copy should be set aside for selling expense, with the Visitors Center receiving \$1 for their work on inventory control, distribution to sales outlets and all record-keeping. Sales outlets would receive \$2 per copy sold. We will approach the library, arts & crafts shop, the Thrift Shop and the hospital gift shop regarding their selling copies on which they would earn \$2 per copy. Jo Ruck mentioned possible church open houses, and if they were interested, they could also earn \$2 per book for each copy they sold. The Visitors Center, too, would receive a similar amount for each copy sold by their volunteers, or at the Visitors Center.

NOTE: The amounts mentioned above are strictly preliminary and will need the approval of the Historical Society, along with the complete marketing plan. Please DO NOT talk to any possible sales outlets mentioning these figures until we have a complete plan ready.

Barbara Brozman and Phyllis Street agreed to discuss the tax implications with Jane Freeman and Connie McMillin, president of SCAHS. It was agreed that we want to include any tax in the sales price. It was further suggested that sales be by check to minimize money-handling.

Ed Allen has received material for almost the entire book, and will do substantive editing this summer before sending to Bruce Ellison for final editing. It is hoped that copies of the completed manuscript will be ready to send to committee members in September, giving them time to review before our next meeting in late October or early November.

Dee Balaker volunteered to have her name appear in the article publicizing the book and searching for info on three topics...pictures of the first clinic, when the Terrace on the Green name came about, and what happened to Grandma's Restaurant-Bakery-Ice Cream Parlor and Lounge.

Here's wishing each and every committee member a great summer!

## REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- Mar. 19, 2002

## NOTE: Next Meeting -- 9:00 am, Tuesday, April 16 at Briarwood

Present at the meeting were Allen, Balaker, Coor, Larson, McCraith-Anderson, Nelson, Ruck, Silvis, Stoneking, Street and Vogel.

Betty Stoneking briefed us on the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee and the preliminary schedule of events. She also showed a sample of the committee's new stationery which used a new logo rather than leveraging the one used by the Visitors Center to represent the community. While this letterhead is intended for internal use, the wisdom of having two different logos appearing in national media needs more thought.

Returning to our history project, Ed Allen shared the report that he gave to the Sun Cities Area Historical Society Board. This showed progress by section, along with the individuals who have been asked to comment on appropriate sections as we seek a factual accounting of the past.

Comments on specific sections of the book included:

- Ed Allen submitted a new draft for the Introduction based on comments received after last month's meeting. Plese send any further comments to him before the April 16 meeting.
- 2) Active Retirement Barbara Brozman and Phyllis Street have completed two parts of their section and turned them over to Ed.
- 3) Health Care Larry Carlino and Lee Vogel are well along on gathering information and preparing a first draft. Ed Allen supplied clippings from 1979-80 newspapers regarding the earliest healthcare. Sun Health Public Relations has interceeded for us with Dr. Hayashi and we be able to will interview him when he returns from vacation at month's end.
- 4) Political Evolution Eleanor Nelson has comments from Hal Lind and Phil Garner. ED will follow-up on Gene Wilson and Sandy Goldstein. Chuck Roach had nothing to add, and was very complementary. Elaine McCraith-Anderson asked to see the text as she has 12 years experience with the PORA Board. (Betty Stoneking also requested a copy, and copies were e-mailed to both following the meeting.)
- 5) Future Issues Several excellent additions and comments were received. The disparity of income between older retirees and newer ones is an important consideration that needs to be included. It was also pointed out that the three issues are being worked on, and that this should be recognized. SCW has a history of addressing problems, and "in true SCW fashion" we are tackling these problems! The goal should be to end the book on a realistic, yet positive, note.
- An Appendix has been added to the list of sections. It includes: lists of chartered and unchartered clubs; roster of PORA Boards, Rec Center Boards and Rec Center General managers; golf course statistics; words to SCW song. Anything else?

7) Book Title -- This resulted in a lively discussion. The list of proposed titles was pruned and Ed Allen will bring copies of cover layouts to the next meeting so that committee members can test designs and title ideas on others before we make a final decision.

Ed Allen reported that he has met with four printing firms, each of which showed evidence of handling projects similar to ours. An initial analysis of completed drafts indicates a book of approximately 240 pages in 6X 9-inch size. This will include 80-90 illustrations and a four-color, soft-bound cover. It appears that in quantities of 10,000, per-copy costs will be less than \$3. Final costs, however, must wait until we can provide the printers with more accurate specifications. We need to complete writing, checking and editing, along with photo selection this summer so that we can turn this over to a printer by late November if we are to meet our February 2003 target date.

Ed also reported that we are in contact with Sun Health as they produce a great deal of material for our audience, and have investigated the best type styles and sizes to use. The matter of book size also needs more investigation. 8-1/2 x 11 allows larger photos, but the fewer pages involved results in a more magazine-like publication. 6 x 9, or 5-1/2 by 8-1/2, are popular sizes for books, and tend to stand on a shelf. The matter of a hard cover was discussed, but would add \$4-5 per copy. The final decision on pricing and marketing will ultimately be decided by the Historical Society but our recommendations are, of course, sought.

"(*Book Title*)", sponsored by the Sun Cities Area Historical Society, was written to commemorate the community's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary on February 15, 2003. It is fitting that we pause at this quarter-century mark to record the beginnings of Sun City West so that its remarkable story is not lost in the inevitable march of time.

The retirement of the first Baby Boomers promises to bring new people, new interests and new leadership to our community. This history is for them, too, as they need to understand the past that shapes our present, and gives momentum to the future. The changes that have taken place over the past 25 years have been immense as the area was transformed from a desert to a city. The changes in the next 25 years will be more subtle, but no less significant. It is our hope that this history will provide perspective to those new to the community as they become involved in the continuing transformation of Sun City West.

Chapter X -- LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

While the task of compiling the history of Sun City West has been completed, the impact of the past still lies ahead of us. Those of us who live in Sun City West, and who have helped compile this history of the first 25 years, believe there are three significant issues that need to be addressed if Sun City West is to remain an attractive destination for potential retirees. It is not our intent to provide solutions, but only to raise consciousness of the critical nature of these issues. Avoiding them won't make them go away - they will only become increasingly serious.

First, is the need to assure an adequate supply of water. For 25 years, we have depended on wells for our water. Studies have shown that the water level is dropping, and as more communities are built around Sun City West, the demand on the underlying aquifer will only increase. The drop in the water table is perhaps most notable at Luke Air Force Base, where the ground has subsided up to 18 feet in certain areas! Alternative water sources are being considered and the Environmental & Water Committee of PORA needs the support of residents, along with residents active involvement in becoming more knowledgeable about the choices that must be made.

Second, are the changing demographics of Sun City West. Twenty-five years ago, most of the first residents were newly retired. Today, four out of ten residents are over 75, according to a study conducted by the Rec Centers in late 2001. As a result, interest in active sports has declined with a corresponding reduction in the income needed to support golf and bowling in particular. While less than a third of the residents play golf regularly, the courses add to the beauty and attractiveness of the community, and thereby benefit everyone. The aging of the community also has a major impact on volunteerism. Organizations that provide critical services to the community, like the Posse and the Prides, are finding it harder to replace those who leave. If there aren't sufficient volunteers, the community will either have to do without, or pay to have these services provided. As Chuck Roach, former DEVCO General Manager for SCW, pointed out in community forums in the early 1990s, the median strips along R.H. Johnson Blvd. are an attractive asset to the community, but are far in excess of what Maricopa County would be willing to pay to maintain. And, that's true of the orange trees along Stardust, and the landscaping along other major thoroughfares. Volunteers like the Prides save residents thousands of dollars a year, and the economic importance of their gift needs to be fully understood, appreciated and recognized. Equally significant to the aging of the population is the aging of the facilities. To attract newcomers, they must be kept in prime condition. Annual recreation center fees paid by residents are the primary source for the funds needed, and as the buildings age, increases in these fees can be expected. Long-time residents remember the first fees of \$60 per year per resident, and lament today's higher cost. Newer residents look at the fees in light of what they paid for memberships in health clubs or local YMCAs in their previous home communities, and find them an incredible

bargain.

Third, is the future marketing of Sun City West. Since 1960, the Sun Cities have benefited from the major investments the Del Webb Corp. has made in advertising and publicizing first, Sun City, then Sun City West, and most recently, Sun City Grand. While the new Pleasant Valley development will assure a continued Del Webb presence, at some point the last home will be built, and the Del Webb organization will

turn their marketing attention to some other area.

Sun City West has benefited greatly from the "Vacation Villa" programs. Thousands of prospective retirees have been drawn to our area by the promise of an inexpensive vacation in the sun. Visitors to Sun City Grand explore Sun City West as well, comparing facilities, activities and costs. Once that program ends, Sun City West will be responsible for attracting prospects. There are many ways this can be done, but all cost money whether for advertising in national media, bill boards on the outskirts of other valley retirement communities, or events that result in nation-wide publicity. And, SCW will be competing for attention with the many other developers of newer retirement communities throughout the Valley of the

An aging population results in a higher turnover of homes. The key question to be addressed is how can our community obtain the steady stream of prospects needed to assure a strong resale market and maintain high property values for all?

#### A Final Word

There are many other issues that could be listed, and which will need attention in the near future. The important issue of governance, for example, is not mentioned here as it has been touched on in the section on PORA. Whatever the issue, it requires an open mind. Unfortunately, sometimes as we grow older, we suffer from a "hardening of the attitudes" in addition to the arteries. But there is great wisdom among those who have lived long and who have overcome many obstacles. We need to apply this collective wisdom to the challenge of keeping Sun City West as attractive and vibrant in the future as it has been in its past.

Excerpted from a Letter to the Editor that appeared in the Sun Cities Independent, June 21-27,2000:

"I chose Sun City West because I believe the best is yet to come. I chose Sun City West because I want to live until I die. I chose Sun City West because there is really nothing to complain about and every reason to be as active as health allows. I chose Sun City West because it provides me with the freedom to do all the things I was too preoccupied to do earlier in life. I chose Sun City West because I love people, I love the desert, I love the simpler lifestyle, and I love change and growing. Every day here is a new adventure.'

"Living is a privilege. Living is a responsibility. Living is an opportunity. Living is also a choice. And living is a challenge. I chose to live here, and I choose to live while I am here. "Get a life!" someone says. I have, and I love it!" Dr. Emil J. Authelet

#### REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- Feb. 19, 2002

NOTE: Next Meeting -- 9:00 am, Tuesday, March 19 at Briarwood

Present at the meeting were Allen, Balaker, Coor, Hjermstad, Nelson, Ruck, Schoeberle, Silvis, Stoneking and Street. Betty introduced two guests: Kay Ginsburg and Lee Vogel. Lee has volunteered to join our committee to work with Larry Carlino on the Health Care Section. Maxine Riffil has resigned to help care for an ill neighbor.

Dee Hjermstad briefed us on the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee that will be having its first meeting later today. Both Dee and Betty are serving on this committee which will help the two committees coordinate activities insofar as needed.

## Reviewing progress, we found:

- Ed Allen submitted drafts for an Introduction and Acknowledgement. Members were asked to review and suggest changes, additions or deletions. We'll review again at our next meeting.
- 2) Pre-history Section written and edited; needs photo captions.
- Pioneer Years first draft is complete. Additional information was provided to be included.
- 4) Physical Evolution written and ready for editing. Ed will send the Rec Center section of the Rec Center general manager as a courtesy. Bill Woodyard has seen the section and commented. Others who might be of help are Bob Williams and Hal Lind.
- 5) Active Retirement Barbara Brozman reported that interviews with early Rec Center leaders, Posse, Interfaith, Sunshine Serenaders, and Variety Show producers are underway or completed. She expects to have a rough draft of this section by the end of March.
- 6) Health Care Larry Carlino is enjoying a cruise of the south Pacific with his wife and will report next month.
- 7) Political Evolution Eleanor Nelson has completed writing her section and provided a copy to Ed. It was felt that we should send this to Randy Fuller as a courtesy. Since Bruce Ellison covered PORA for many years, we'll also ask him for comment. Ed Allen will send the section to both individuals.
- 8) Final chapter on "Issues Affecting the Future" While the committee agreed that this section should be included, it was felt that a questionnaire was not necessary. The committee can identify the key issues, and this chapter can be written as representing our collective opinion. In the group's opinion, the four key issues to be covered are: water, demographics, future marketing of SCW and governance. The later is touched on in the preceding chapter, so we will only deal with the first three in this section. Allen and Carlino will write it and submit a draft to committee members for comment.

Ed Allen reported we have two editors helping us: Clarine Clampitt and Bruce Ellison. Each was given the first section of the book, and each found different things to be corrected. The Rec Center general manager, R. G. Anderson-Wyckoff, has told Bruce that he can do editing for us on "company time" subject to his other workload. Thank you, R. G.

Two additional book titles were added to our growing list: "Hello Sun City West, Goodbye Lizard Acres" and "You'll Remember This". Betty suggested we have a contest to name the book, or let people vote on the name, as ways to gain publicity.

Ed reviewed a list of possible printers that appear to meet our needs. Namely, ability to accept text of disk or CD, graphics personnel to help with book layout, and the right size – not too big, nor too small – to handle our project. Ed will meet with the three firms and report back at the next meeting.

#### REPORT OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE -- Jan. 15, 2002

## NOTE: Next Meeting -- 9:00 am, Tuesday, February 19 at Briarwood

We welcomed a new member, Dee Hjemstad, to our committee. Others present were Allen, Balaker, Carlino, Coor, Larson, Ruck, Schoeberle, and Stoneking.

The major part of our time was spent reviewed the individual sections, and the places where help is needed.

- A. Preparing the Way for SCW Complete
- B. The Pioneer Years –Judy Schoeberle reported they have 9 excellent interviews to draw from, and three more are planned. Mary Silvis and she have gathered many personal accounts of life in the1978-79 period, and they will be able to provide the book with a sense of what the early residents found when they moved in, and what they did with their time.
- C. Physical Evolution of the Community This section is almost completely written with a few small pieces of missing information. Louie Coor is gathering data on the golf course opening dates, lengths, etc. Jo Ruck agreed to make a third contact of the three missing churches (Crown of Life Lutheran, First Assembly of God and Palm West Community Church).
- D. Growing Scope of Active Retirement No report as Street and Brozman were missing. Allen will contact them.
- E. Growth of Health Care and Human Services Larry Carlino reported that the section on the Foundation is done and that he is gathering material on assisted living. Betty Stoneking volunteered to take the extensive history received from Sun Health and to edit if. Jane Freeman had given Larry the names of several key Sun Health officials, and the edited version will be sent to them for comment. Dr. Hyashi remains as elusive as ever. It was suggested that we see if we can get the WESTER interested in pursuing a story about him as a way of getting something for our book. In a subsequent phone call, Ed agreed to contact Lyle Thompson on Thursday.
- F. Political Evolution of the Community No report as Anderson was missing. Earlier this month, she had indicated she had about completed the section.
- G. Issues Affecting Future History Ed and Larry have agreed to tackle this after their respective sections are complete. It appears that this section will focus on five key issues: Aging of the community (people and facilities), challenges to our current form of governance, growth of the surrounding area, water, and maintaining high property values. There are many, many issues but we will seek to identify a few, key ones that the community will have to deal with in the years ahead.
- H. Title and Cover Design Jo Ruck added "Memories Are Made of This ...The Past, Present and Future of SCW" to our list of possible book titles.

In discussing publicity for the history project, Jo Ruck offered to send copies of the photo taken last month to our three local newspapers. Ed will send her a suggested caption and identify the members in the photos. We'll also list those not present. Ed will also prepare a brief article for each of the papers seeking information to fill in some of the holes in our knowledge – and build interest in the subject at the same time.

The matter of celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was mentioned, and Dee Hjermstad suggested we call this to the attention of Elaine McGrath-Anderson as the Rec Centers would be the best positioned to provide leadership for such an event.

The need for a "marketing plan" was briefly discussed. Jo Ruck suggested that the Visitors Center might be a good source to contact regarding distribution. Ed Allen indicated he had asked them if they were interested, and they would be willing to assist.

In discussing future issues, the subject of "volunteerism" came up as it is unlikely that tomorrow's residents will view this differently than those of the past. Dee Hjermstad noted that this is already of concern, and no place more than the Rec Center Board. There are three openings on the next Board, and so far only two individuals have filed. Filing must be completed by February 1, and she strongly urged us to encourage good people to volunteer for this important position. She even offered to help get the necessary 200 signatures for capable candidates!

First, we'll review where we stand on fleshing out our preliminary outline for the book. We'll go through the outline, section-by-section, to review progress. I'd like each of the section teams to report where they stand on:

- Gathering source material
- Preparing an outline for their section
- Writing of a first draft

It would be ideal if each team had their section outlined, and could share this with the committee. That way, we can become aware of areas of overlap, or of missing information that needs to be included, early in the development cycle.

Second, each of the section teams will be asked to set goals for the work they will complete by the time of our next meeting in December. This should help us identify areas where additional help may be needed.

Third, we'll look at the "big picture." Once drafts are written, how do we edit the material to make sure the style is consistent throughout? How do we go about scanning photos and laying out the book? What are some of the latest printing technologies available, and how can we best use them? If you're not involved in the preparation of one of the book sections, perhaps you'd like to volunteer to work in one of these areas.

I'm sure you'll have other items to bring up at the Nov. 6 meeting, and we'll make sure we allow time for them. I look forward to seeing you on the 6<sup>th</sup>!

PS -- Fall colors are at their peak in Wisconsin, and we won't be heading south until later in the month. We expect to be in SCW by Nov. 2, so if you can't make the meeting, please call me at 975-1815 after that date. See you soon!

#### REPORT ON APRIL 24 MEETING OF SCW HISTORY COMMITTEE

I'm referring to this as a "report" rather than "minutes" of the April 24<sup>th</sup> meeting as I only took note of key items. I apologize for not capturing all that was discussed as we certainly covered a wide range of subjects -- but this will remind us of major decisions when we regroup after the "summer break."

Present were Ed Allen, David Andrews, Dee Balaker, Barbara Brozeman, Larry Carlino, Louie Coor, Althea Curfman, John Larson, Elaine McCraith-Anderson, Eleanor Anderson, Mary Silvis, Betty Stoneking and Phyllis Street. Our thanks to Betty for arranging for the room at Briarwood, as well as, for coffee and water!

The sunburst logo adopted by the Visitors Center, and the accompanying "Sun City West -- Everything Under The Sun," were enthusiastically endorsed by those present. We will include them in the eventual cover design for the book.

Our working outline still looks pretty good! Two suggested additions were the Post Office controversy in Section 3, and the early trailer for medical care in Section 5. The "champions" reported on each of the sections, and work is definitely underway. Betty Stoneking has written an Introduction to the book and a copy was given to each person. Discussion was postponed until later.

In reviewing the process we will follow, three points were emphasized.

First, be sure to document sources for all information as these will be needed when it comes time to double-check the accuracy of content.

Second, section "champions" were encouraged to prepare an outline as information is gathered. This provides a helpful road map to assure content is orderly and as complete as possible. It will also simplify writing. We agreed that our goal will be to have outlines for each section when we meet next Nov.

Third, include as many human interest stories as possible. Our three "Pioneer" members, Mary Silvis, Althea Curfman and Dee Balaker can help find stories to illustrate key subjects. For example, the grand opening of the Sundome would be more interesting if told through the personal experience of an attendee.

About two-thirds of our committee will be here for the summer, or major parts of it, so work will continue. A summary of "Interests and Skills" was distributed, and can be used in getting help with transcribing interviews, typing up notes, etc.

NEXT MEETING: 9:00 am, Tuesday, Nov. 6 at Briarwood. It was agreed that the summer goal would be for "champions" for each section to outline the proposed content. We can then examine the outlines for duplication, or any significant omissions.

This is going to be a fantastic committee!! Ten of the 16 who volunteered to work on this project were able to attend this introductory meeting. We have a wealth of talent, interest and experience in the group. We also stand to benefit from the presence of Jane Freeman, one of the co-authors of the "Jubilee" – Sun City's 25-year history.

Here's what we accomplished in this first meeting:

- As background, Ed Allen explained the Sun Cities Area Historical Society's role as the sponsoring organization. Two of its Board members, Ed Allen and Phyllis Street, will be actively engaged in the project. The SCAHS will provide access to its files on SCW but material may not leave the facility. As sponsor, the SCAHS will help fund this project with the extent of the financial assistance to be determined as we get a better idea of costs. It is expected that this project will more than cover its costs with any proceeds going towards the support of other SCAHS programs.
- A "Preliminary Outline" for the SCW history was adopted, subject to change as the story unfolds. The outline contains 7 major sections, and those volunteering to "champion" a section are listed on the attached outline. The work they will be doing is outlined on the page, "Process & Timetable." Others will be needed as notes need to get typed up, or rough drafts need to be edited.
- 3) It was agreed that a timeline of events taking place since 1978 would be helpful to make sure we don't overlook anything important. Barbara Griggs volunteered to help with this, going through news clippings, newsletters and other papers on file at the SCAHS. Another volunteer or two would be appreciated.
- 4) It was suggested that we start looking into printing options so as to benefit from professional advice regarding size and cost early in the game. Betty Stoneking has had personal experience with Arizona Library Binding and showed a sample of a hard-cover book that they produced for \$4 each. Ed Allen will follow up.
- A symbol representing SCW is needed. The one used originally was also used for Sun City. The Visitors Center and various clubs are using a sunburst with the words "Sun City West...Everything Under the Sun." Allen will bring a sample to the next meeting.
- 6) Next meeting was set for Tuesday, April 24 at 9:00 am. We will try to locate a meeting room in SCW and will alert members as soon as we have one.

- One or two committee members needed to sift through archives to develop timeline of major events since 1978
- 2) Adopt the "preliminary" outline, subject to change as project progresses
- 3) Obtain "champions" for each major section of the outline to:
  - a) Investigate locate sources, gather source material, interview key individuals
  - b) Identify key events, activities and individuals. Create a section outline.
  - c) <u>Describe</u> these key events and activities, jot down any appropriate human interest stories, attach related source material and photos. Do as much writing as is comfortable, knowing others are willing to...
  - d) Refine drafts of text and captions for illustrations; edit for style and clarity.
  - e) Submit final text, photos and captions to sources to double-check facts
- 4) Obtain volunteers to fill-in any missing parts of the history, to interview early residents for human interest stories and to write up their findings

- 1) April December, 2001 Steps 1-3c and 4 above
- 2) January March, 2002 Step 3d above
- 3) April October, 2002 Step 3e above. Finalize content. Select printer.
- February, 2003 Copies available for distribution by the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ground-breaking, Feb. 15, 1978.
