DevCo's Sun City West sales top \$92 million

Sun City West new home sales topped \$92 million during the first half of 1979, according to a Del E. Webb Development Co. spokesman.

The company also said that of that amount, more than \$51 million in new sales was recorded during the second quarter this year.

More than 1,250 new homes were sold in the new resort-retirement community during the sixmonth period. Sales were best during April, when 440 were recorded.

More than 180,000 persons visited the Sun City West sales pavilion during the first half of 1979.

DevCo construction crews are currently completing approximately 40 homes per week in Sun City West. More than 1,000 have been built in 1979. Construction of the 5,700-acre first phase of Sun City West began in February 1978.

Estimates are that approximately 2,300 persons are Sun City West residents.

newly-opened R.H. Johnson Recreation Center is Arizona's largest private complex for recreational and creative activities, according to DevCo. In use are the Olympic-size swimming pool, jacuzzi, handball and racquetball courts, tennis courts, table tennis room, game room, indoor shuffleboard courts, 25-table billiards room, therapy pools, crafts rooms and social hall.

Opening soon will be the center's 24-lane bowling alley, 18-hole miniature golf course, volleyball and badminton courts, lawn bowling greens, physical fitness room, ¼-mile running track with obstacle course and 40,000-volume library.

Currently under construction are Sun City West's first shopping center and the Sundome Center for the Performing Arts



Construction of the 6,800-seat Sundome is expected to be completed in mid-1980.



The Sundome Center for the Performing Arts (right) is progressing toward an expected completion in the second quarter of 1980. The \$6.3 million facility will seat 6,800 persons, making it the largest multipurpose theater in Arizona. 


