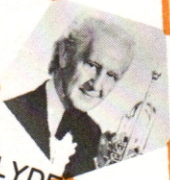

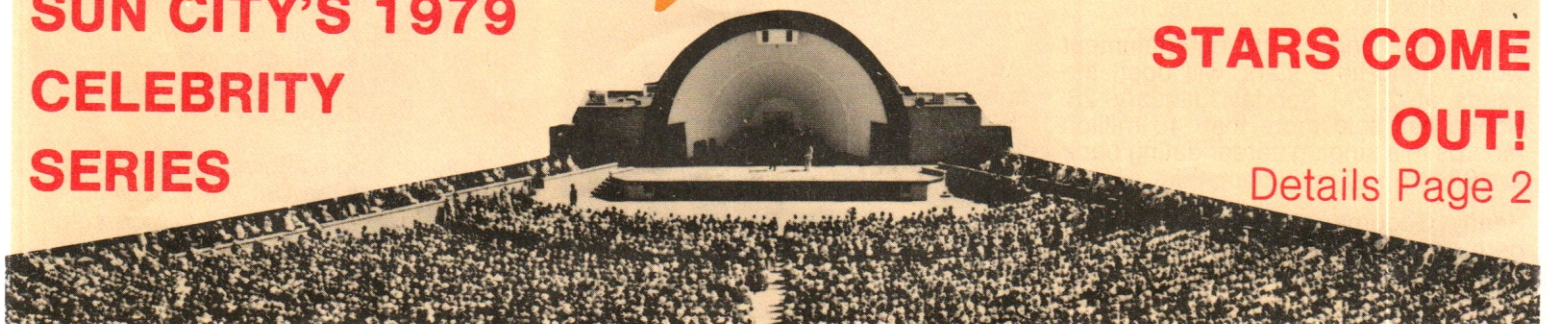

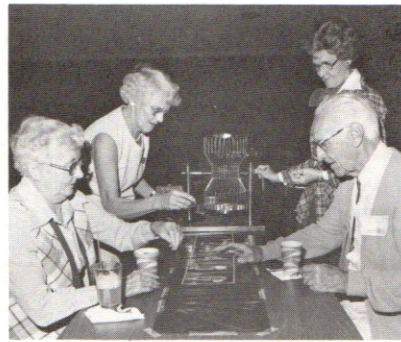

has been a giant in the music field for almost 50 years.

The singing-dancing duo of Tony Martin and Cyd Charisse will hit the Sun Bowl stage at 2 PM Sunday, February 25.

"Musical Memories," a star-filled package that includes Clyde McCoy and his "Sugar Blues", the Harmonicats and the Ted Weems Orchestra will be presented at 2 PM Sunday, March 4.

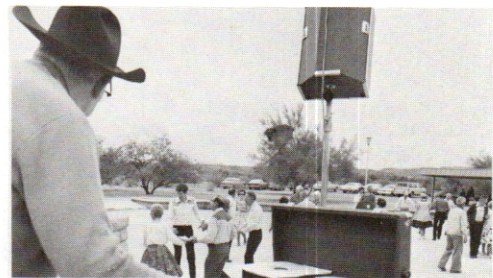
The stars of the Lawrence Welk television show will close out the series at 2 PM, Sunday, March 18. The show will

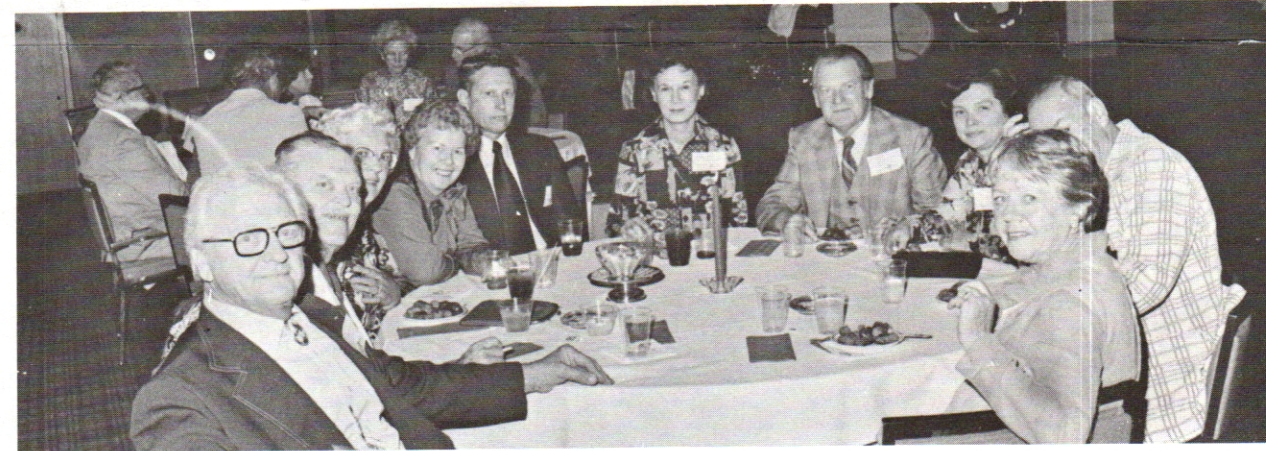

Much of the back nine of Sun City West's Hillcrest Golf Course is visible in this aerial photograph. The new course, which opened for play in February, measures 6,960 yards from the championship tees and plays to par 72 for men and 75 for women. Two of Hillcrest's three lakes also can be

seen. Water comes into play on 14 holes. A total of 78 sand traps dot the lush, green layout. The course is already being hailed as one of Arizona's most challenging. Hillcrest is the first of six golf courses in Phase I of Sun City West.

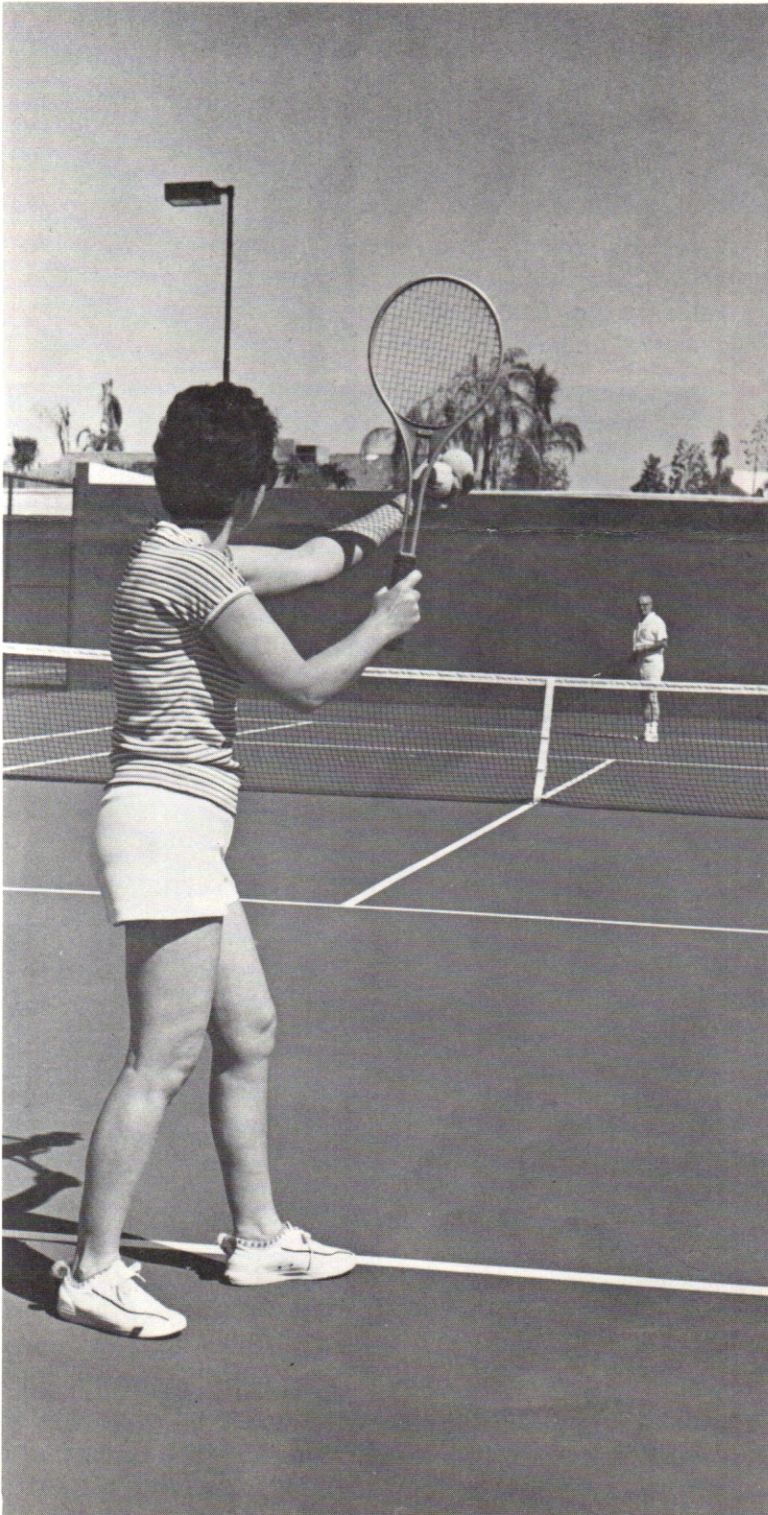

TENNIS COURTS OPEN AT JOHNSON RECREATION CENTER

Tennis anyone?

Yes, the courts have opened at Johnson Recreation Center. Eight courts will be available from 8 AM to 5 PM daily for play by Sun City West residents and their guests and Vacation Special visitors. Activity cards must be shown.



A three-day, two-night trip to spectacular Lake Powell in northern Arizona is planned for May 10-11-12. Highlighting the venture will be an all-day boat trip that will take in Lake Powell's ever-changing scenic beauty. Steep walls of red sandstone seem to climb out of the blue-green waters as the boat winds its way into hidden canyons and coves. Featured on the trip is Rainbow Bridge, one of nature's most astounding feats of architecture. The natural bridge is so large that the United States Capitol Building could fit beneath it with room to spare. The trip will cost \$85 per person (based on double occupancy), which includes the round-trip bus ride, two nights at Wahweap Lodge, the eight-hour boat trip and box lunch. Secretary Betty Hunt will begin taking reservations and checks in full on Monday, April 16. Trip limited to 42 persons.



From the moment one tees off on the first tee until the ball is in the cup on the final hole, Sun City West's new Hillcrest Golf Course is one challenge after another. Measuring 6,960 yards from the championship tees (6,411 from regular tees),



Hillcrest features water on 14 holes, 78 sand traps and more than 1,000 trees, all which add to the course's oasis image. Hillcrest is the first of six courses planned for Sun City West's first phase.

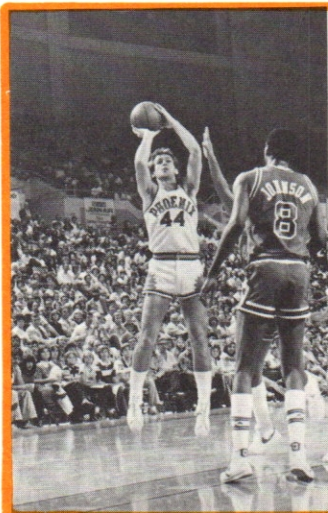
Residents are reminded to have their cards in their possession when participating in recreation center-sponsored activities or using recreation center facilities.

A groundbreaking ceremony for Sun City West Shopping Center No. 1 will be conducted at 3 PM Tuesday, April 10 on the southeast corner of R.H. Johnson Boulevard and Camino Del Sol.

The \$2.7 million facility, which will include a Safeway supermarket and a Walgreen drug store among its tenants, is tentatively scheduled to be completed in the first quarter of 1980. It will be built by the Del E. Webb Corporation.

The 126,000 square foot center also will have a coffee shop and Mary Jane's Interiors, a furniture/decorator store. Seventeen other retail shops are anticipated for the center.

The center will have parking for 949 cars.

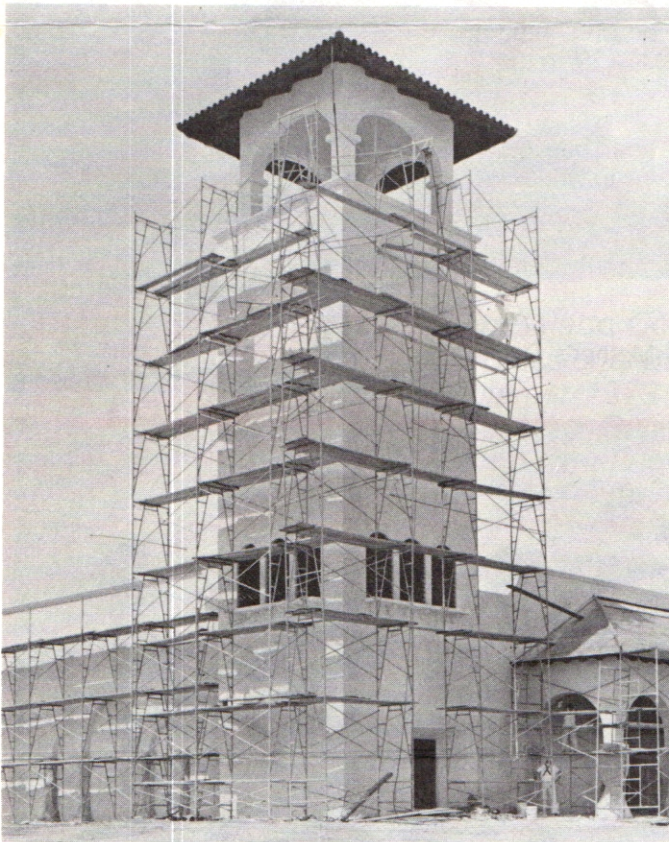


JOHNSON RECREATION CENTER CONSTRUCTION NEARS COMPLETION

The choices include "subscribing" to fire protection service from the Rural-Metro Fire Department, annexing the community to the Sun City Fire District and forming an independent Sun City West Fire District.

The committee plans to continue its study through the summer and report its findings and recommendations in the fall so residents may vote on proposals.

The Del E. Webb Development Co. has set aside land in Sun City West for a fire station.

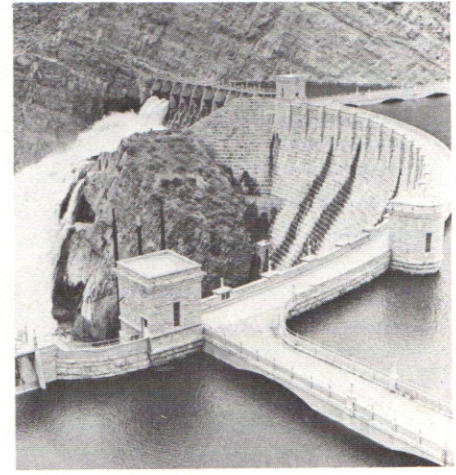

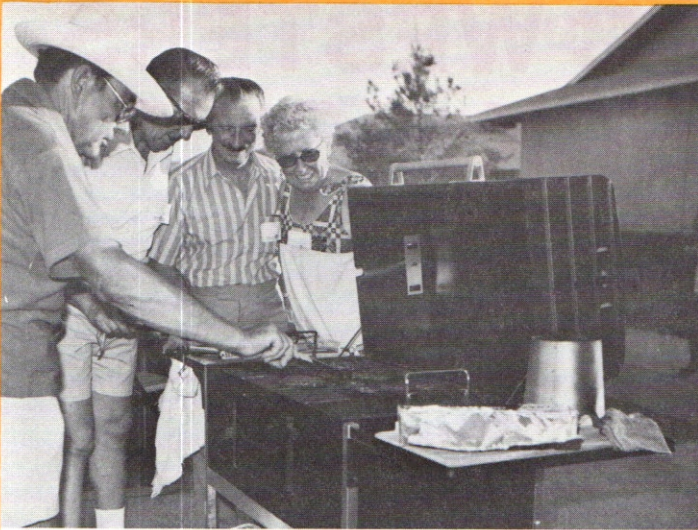
NEW SQUARE DANCE LESSONS SET TO BEGIN

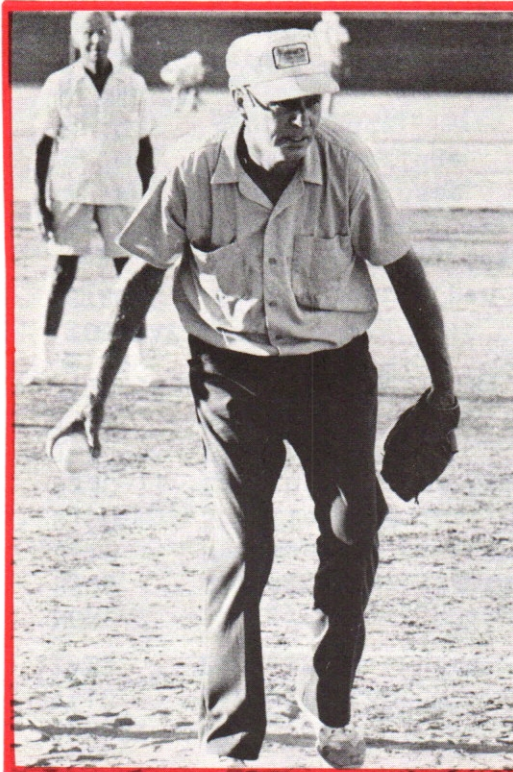

The slow-pitch league, which is comprised of six teams, began its season in July. The season will continue through mid-September. Watch the local papers for dates and times of upcoming games.

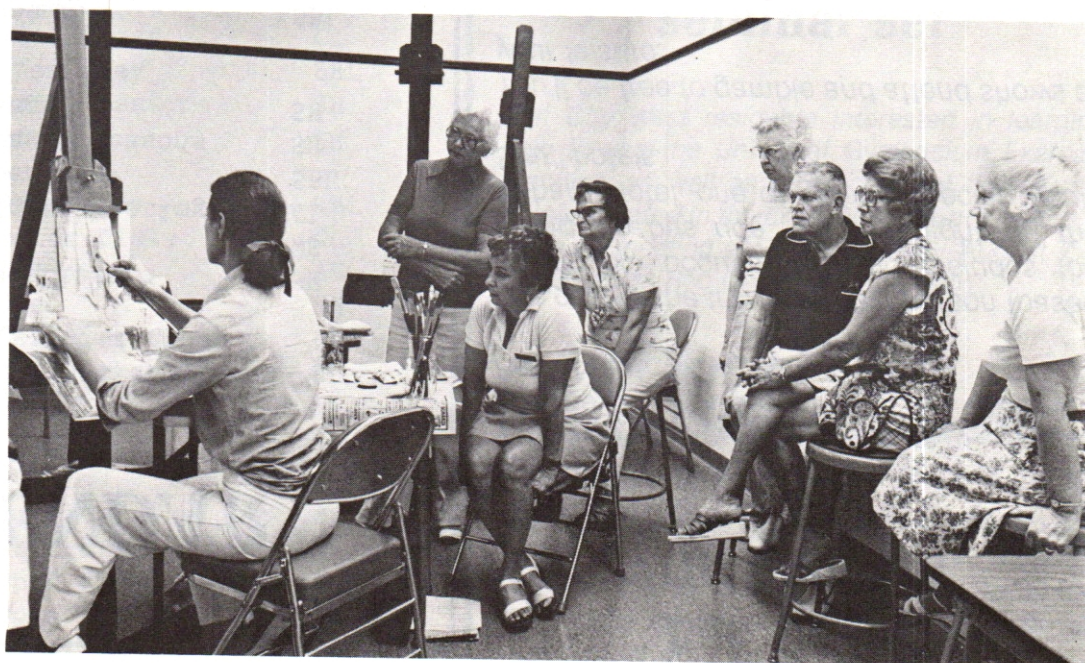

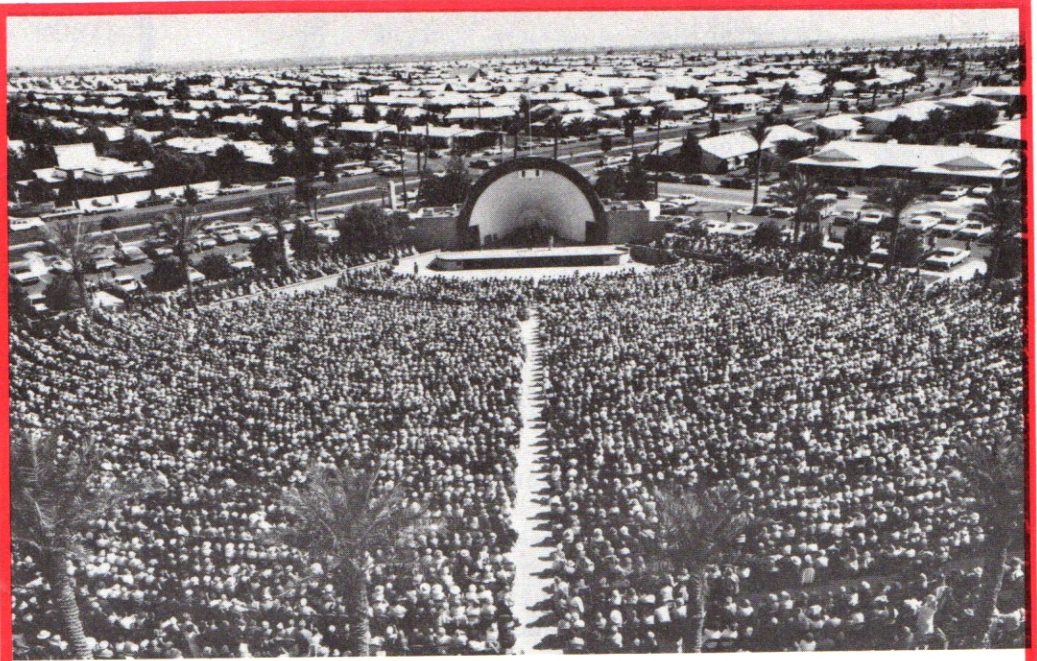

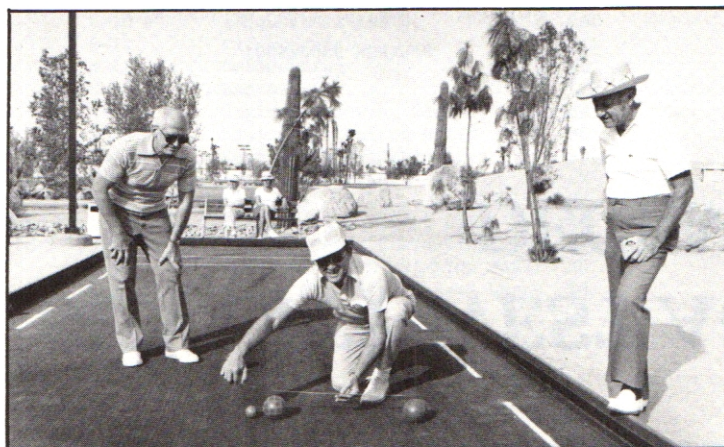
Gardeners

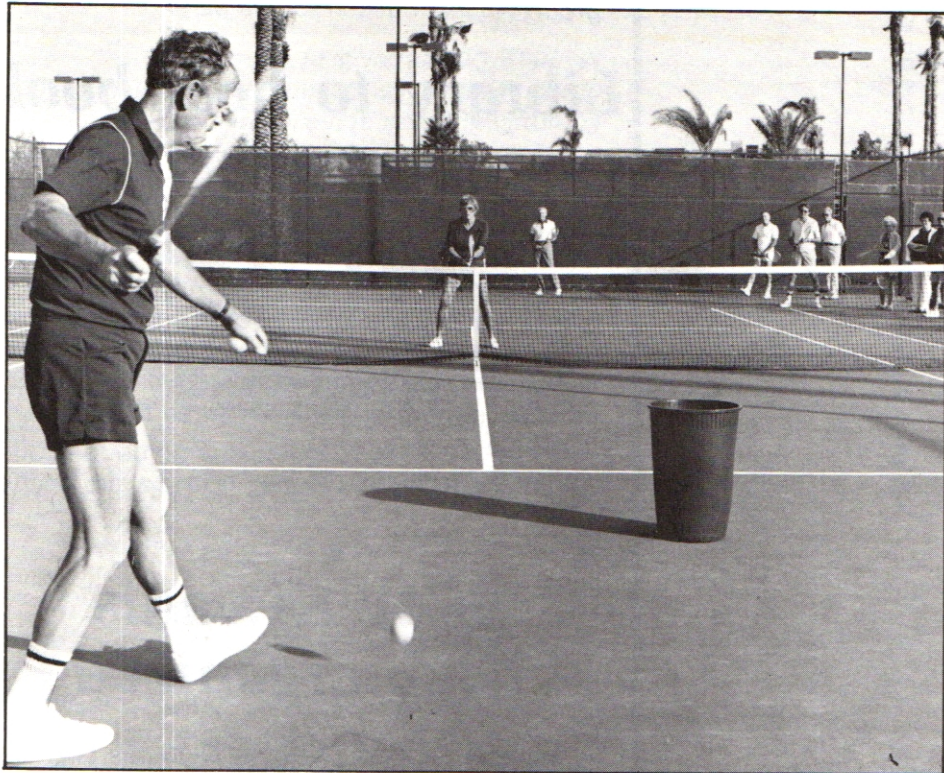
