





Tickets for the concert may be purchased at the Sundial Box Office immediately before the concert. Admission is \$5.



Amy Alcott, the LPGA's third leading money winner last year, has joined the already-strong field for the first annual \$100,000 Sun City Classic golf tournament.


The 72-hole tournament will be played February 27-March 2 over the 6,900-yard, par 72 Hillcrest Golf Course in Sun City West.


Alcott's name joins a list of entries that includes Nancy Lopez, the LPGA's Player-of-the-Year in 1978 and 1979, and Donna Caponi-Young, ranked fifth last year. Lopez is the only woman professional golfer ever to earn more than \$200,000 in one season.


He will speak at 2 PM and 8 PM in Sundial Auditorium.






Library activities

Celebrities Series lists three shows during February


February will be a star-studded month as three Celebrities Series shows will hit the Sun Bowl stage.




Sewers hear pattern talk




"DEVCO - Westers, speak - listen"


Fitness Festival scheduled for SC/SCW communities

Recreation Centers membership authorizes DEVCO to continue management until break-even time

With more than 900 members of Recreation Centers of Sun City West, Inc., voting at a special membership meeting in the Sundome on November 21, it was decided that the Del W. Webb Development Co. will continue to manage the recreation facilities until a "break-even" financial point is reached. At the gathering, which was chaired by John Meeker. DEVCO President, members rejected two other proposals which had been offered to the membership by the Governing Board of RCSCW. Joseph Aubin, DEVCO executive vice-president; Gerald Williams, DEVCO chief legal counsel; and Meeker comprise the incorporating Governing Board.

The membership meeting, officially announced November 7, was called because members were concerned about the impending date on which DEVCO would turn over operations of the facilities to membership management.

The RCSCW incorporating articles required that the turnover of operations take place 18 months from the date of incorporation, March 1, 1981. Thus, the Governing Board developed alternative proposals which had to be voted upon by the membership.

The first two of the proposals called for DEVCO to continue managing the facilities, the third for the original turn-over date to be retained. The vote was overwhelming for the Webb Company to retain management; 892 hands went up in favor of the status quo as 20 monitors stood in the aisles of the Sundome and counted. Only 39 persons voted for the original turn over date.

In offering to continue management, the Governing Board presented two alternatives and this choice comprised the second vote. Members rejected that DEVCO continue management for a simple one-year period, or until March

1982, and decided instead that the breakeven point should be the determining factor. Both proposals called for the establishment of an advisory committee to be elected from among SCW Rec Center members.

That advisory committee will consult with the Governing Board and serve as a communications link with the total membership. Meeker explained that any member of RCSCW who wishes to serve on the advisory committee may submit a resume of qualifications and background in 200 words or less to the Rec Center office before December 15.

All resumes received will be posted in full on the Rec Center office bulletin board from December 15 to January 15. A general membership election of nine persons to form the advisory committee will be held after that date at a time to be announced later.

Tree trimming party scheduled for SC Westers


